Daily Routine

The daily routine for a live in carer will depend upon a number of factors such as what time the person being cared for normally wakes up and goes to bed and how much care is needed. The carer will work to establish a routine that works well for all.

Hours of Work and time off during the day

The carer will work actively for around 8 hours a day on a flexible basis and will be available at any time. A carer should be able to take a 2 hour break during the day.

Night Calls and waking nights

Live in carers sleep in the house and are able to respond in the event of an emergency. Sometimes a client will need some extra assistance at night which is understandable but if night time waking happens on a prolonged and regular basis it may be necessary to arrange for a second carer to cover waking nights so that the main carer can take care of the client during the day.

Carer Holidays

Your main carer will work for anywhere from 2 to 26 weeks at a time before taking a holiday which will typically be between 1 and 4 weeks in duration. ➤ Live-in care

Live-in care is when a carer moves into the home of the person being cared for to provide care.

➤ Personal care

➤ Overnight care

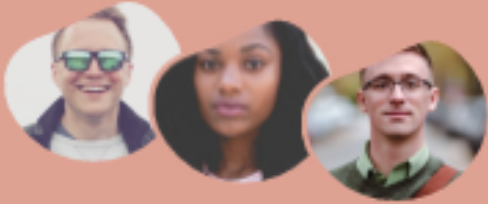
